## Financial Aid Opportunities for the 2017-2018 School Year

**Meredith-Dunn School:** To apply for financial aid, your child must have met all admissions guidelines and be accepted for school enrollment. Meredith-Dunn School offers financial aid to families based on financial need. A limited amount of funds are set aside each year by our Board of Trustees to be used for this purpose. Aid is awarded on a first come, first served basis by the Financial Aid Committee.

Smart Aid conducts the financial need analysis for Meredith-Dunn School. Families applying for financial aid will need to:

- 2.) Include a letter explaining the family's circumstances and return with MD application to the school's Business Office,
